**b. About your project, what are you seeking funding for?**

Girvan & District Attractions, run by local volunteers, was founded in 1973 and became a registered SCIO charity in 2019. Free community events are provided for all in the Girvan area: from residents to the general public and tourists alike. We use community events as the driving tool to reduce isolation, deprivation and to increase community cohesion in the area, while at the same time helping to boost economic growth of the town.

We organise and deliver community events such as the annual Carrick Lowland Gathering, Civic Week and the opening of Stumpy Jail for historical and educational visits for schools, tourists and local people. We also organise the annual Spooky Stumpy and Girvan & South Carrick Community Firework Display. We work with other community groups and organisations including youth groups, senior citizens groups, local democracy groups, sports groups, events organisations, emergency services, local schools and religious organisations to achieve the aims of the charity.

The area of Girvan & South Carrick is a rural setting , the town of Girvan is surrounded by local villages we ensure that our events incorporate the villages. Girvan which is on Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation 2020 most deprived 10% which shows that the residents of the town suffer from poverty and all aspects that relate to this by organising community events we hope to give opportunities to these residents who otherwise due to their level of deprivation would not have the finances to be able to attend community events if there was a charge. We ensure all our main events are free by having free events this ensures any person from any financial background can attend our events and feel part of their community this is also of benefit to their mental health as they don't become socially isolated.

Our community events bring about an economic benefit for the town by attracting visitors to the town to attend our events. In return visitors spend money in the town. Girvan Attractions also use local suppliers where possible when organising our events. This also helps to boost the profile of our local area

Girvan Attractions have a building where we store all our equipment for our charity works. By owning our own equipment this means we can use it at several events, it also benefit other charities who borrow the equipment. Purchasing also saves the charity the cost of hiring similar equipment at each of our events. We also store equipment for other community groups such as Carrick resilience team, Girvan Christmas Street Party, Girvan Horticultural Society and we also store the towns Christmas lights. We have had request from other groups for storage, but we were at full capacity in our previous building. The funding would be used to complete capital works to the building to secure the building which we have recently purchased with bricking up of windows, doorways and the instillation of security walls and gates around the forecourt. We will also purchase new led lighting and installing CCTV cameras to ensure charity equipment is protect and the installation of a new floor for the building and tarmacking of the forecourt

The need for this project has been identified by a variety of local charities who are struggling to continue their charity aims due to the lack of facilities in the town to be able to secure their equipment which allows for the charity to perform its charitable purpose.

This funding will allow for us to be able to provide a secure and safe premises where groups can secure their equipment as well as our own equipment without this it would not be functional for groups to be able to facility their outcomes

For example Carrick Resilience team store lighting and generators in our building these are used in times of need similar to in 2025 when storm Eowyn hit they used the equipment in the local community to provide rest centres to those that went a week with no electricity. This is just one example of the need for the community to have access to storage facilities so that we can respond

The social benefits will be that our project will not just benefit our own charity but other local charities we will show this benefit by how many groups can now use the facility that we have recently purchased.
