

Spes Bona: Hear from Ayrshire Fisherman Robin Gibson, co-owner of local fishing boat 'Spes Bona,' about his life as a fisherman on the Firth of Clyde.

Additional New Project for ART

Paths For All Funding Award

We are thrilled to have been awarded an up to £100,000 grant from Scottish national walking charity Paths for All's Ian Findlay Path Fund to upgrade the active travel route running through the tunnel, enabling the local community to walk, wheel or cycle more for their everyday journeys.

This is a tremendous boost for our project. Initially we were focused on creating a mural, however, this new injection of funding means that we can now upgrade the active-travel path.

From 22 January and in partnership with Ayrshire Roads Alliance, we have started to create a new surface which will provide a safer and more colourful, joyful journey through the tunnel. We've improved the drainage at the entrance and cleared some of the overgrown shrubbery. This will make the path safer and more accessible. We've been advised work will be ongoing for a period of 6 weeks with the tunnel closed at times as necessary for public safety.

We'd like to thank Paths for All's Ian Findlay Path Fund, supported by Transport Scotland and the Scottish Government, for the opportunity to upgrade the path.
