	objectives include the advancement of education (community involvement in the creation of art-	
	works and heritage films on	active-travel paths); community development by engaging people of all
	ages; school-pupils; student	s; youth and older groups and other interested individuals in the creative
	process; the advancement o	f the arts, heritage and culture by engaging people's interest in art and





	developing their artistic abilities; and for this particular project – bringing to life through art Ayrshire's culture, heritage and social history, and improving the conditions of life through the creation of a multi-purpose community venue.
	The tunnel has been cleaned of the offending graffiti and the mural is being installed in four separate stages as funding is raised. As of April 2025 the first three stages have been completed and the mural hung with the involvement of several schools, colleges and community groups working with Thriving Communities on an outreach basis.
	In effect our local communities are creating an art gallery 150 metres long recording the rich heritage, social and cultural history of Ayrshire. In addition, young people are making short films which visitors to the mural can access via QR codes to see and hear the real stories being depicted on the mural.
	We are now seeking funding for stage 4 of the mural which will include the further involvement of local schools and community groups. Our artist has scheduled two weeks for leading community workshops for the progression of this, the final stage, of the mural. This model of community involvement has worked well in the past.
C	What community will this project be delivered in and what communities will benefit? The artwork will be available for people in the local community but also to visitors to the area from wider Scotland, the rest of the UK and from overseas who travel to this cultural-rich area. To date we have involved over 2,000 local people, mainly from South Ayrshire schools and colleges but also involving the older generation through the involvement of several local care-homes, in the creation of the artwork. We believe involving so many of our local communities will provide a sense of ownership and help safeguard the artwork created.
d	If your project will require maintenance in future years how will your organisation achieve/fund this? All capital expenditure on the infrastructure is the responsibility of SAC and ARA but the charity is responsible for the upkeep of the mural within the tunnel. We estimate the mural will have a lifespan of twenty-five years. We estimate we will need to raise approximately £5,000 per annum to keep the mural clean, fresh and vibrant. So far, we have received tremendous support for the project, and we believe this will continue when the final stage of the mural is completed through visitor online donations and through our continuing fundraising activities. We also plan to sell related merchandise (e.g. mugs, Christmas cards, jigsaws etc) to supplement our fundraising activities.
