or local sports organisations by melting the ice pad. Curling in Ayr ceased due to the shareholders of Ayrshire Curlers Limited, who owned Ayr Ice Rink, putting the private limited company into voluntary liquidation on 26th September 2023. This meant the end of curling, ice skating and ice hockey at Ayr Ice Rink. A Steering Group was formed to examine the possibility of creating a new ice rink, primarily for curling use in the winter but available for other sports in the summer. The rink would be constructed, allowing for improved technology in ice management, enhanced energy efficiency and greater environmental considerations which would make it sustainable. The organisation has moved forward with its plans and, to date has registered Curl Ayrshire Charity's Articles of Association with Companies House as a company limited by guarantee with no shareholders; has achieved charitable status with the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR); has appointed directors; and has opened a new charity bank account with Virgin Money. Consequently, Curl Ayrshire Charity is now looking ahead to fundraising and securing a suitable site in Ayr to build the new curling rink. Having looked at a significant number of possible locations it has been concluded that in/around Ayr is the best location, not only for existing members but to attract new members to grow the business. The expected build cost will be approximately £2.7m and has considerable backing from Scottish Curling and South Ayrshire Council, as well as strong interest from local politicians and existing 340 members. The business plan will be presented to various national and local funding bodies to support this highly ambitious project. Curling is built around the ice, but more importantly around the social bonds it creates. The new facility will include seating areas, bar and catering facilities which will help to retain and attract new members and provide a service to the local community.

c What community will this project be delivered in and what communities will benefit?

Our preferred site is in the North Ayr Ward at Glenmuir place and will benefit not only the local North Ayr community but as South Ayrshire no longer has any ice sports facility will be of benefit to anyone in South Ayrshire and beyond.

The Ayr North Locality Plan April 2024 has five main priorities which includes "Improving outcomes for young people" and "Building healthier communities".

Priority One of South Ayrshire Council Community Plan 2023-2028 states that within "Play, Sport and Recreation" everyone can access a range of high quality, safe, well maintained, accessible places with opportunities for play, sport and recreation.





Community led local economic development, and a place-based economic strategy is a core driver in the SAC Strategic Economic Plan. It seeks to create vibrant communities and economic growth that is inclusive, enabling as many people as possible to contribute to, and benefit from, economic growth.

Scottish Curling is committed to promoting the sport and increasing participation levels among all ages, sexes and abilities. Its mission is to develop a robust infrastructure of clubs and facilities to support the growth of the sport and increase the number of people who enjoy curling in Scotland.

According to Public Health Scotland there is robust evidence that regular physical activity provides a range of physical,

mental, social, environmental and economic benefits, including:

- Reducing the risk of many long-term conditions.
- Developing and maintaining physical and mental function, enabling people to retain independence in later life.
- Supporting social inclusion.
- Helping maintain a healthy weight and reducing inequalities, particularly for those with longterm conditions.

In addition to the multiple health benefits of physical activity, societies that are more active can generate additional returns on investment.

More specifically, physical activity can positively contribute to several policy areas including Education and Children's Services, Strong, Safe and Sustainable Communities, Health and Social Care, Local Economies, Inclusive Growth and the Environment.

Sport and physical activity can enhance the contribution of local government to education and children's services through:

- Supporting physical and cognitive development.
- Promoting physical and health literacy, laying the foundations for lifelong participation.
- Improving educational attainment, either directly (improved grades, school engagement, behaviour and reduced absenteeism) or indirectly (by enhancing skills such as self-control and concentration, team working and time management).

What can Curl Ayrshire Charity do about it?

We realise the importance of helping the local community and by building the ice rink right in the middle of an area of deprivation, which is already a sporting hub, with football, bowling, gymnastics
