Purchase of scout hall land		

About your project/what are you seeking funding for?

This project proposes the redevelopment of a Scout group-owned property into a vibrant community hub. The initiative will directly support two key outcomes:

- Promoting good mental health and wellbeing
- Tackling social isolation and loneliness

The building will be transformed into a safe, inclusive space which could offer a range of community-led services and activities designed to improve wellbeing and foster connection.

48th Ayrshire Scout Group are seeking funding to purchase the land from South Ayrshire Council which will include legal fees.

What community will this project be delivered in and what communities will benefit?

Dundonald is a vibrant rural village in South Ayrshire with a strong sense of community, but like many small settlements, it faces challenges around access to wellbeing services, social isolation, and opportunities for intergenerational connection. The redevelopment of the Scout group property into a Community Wellbeing Hub will provide a much-needed inclusive space for residents of all ages. It could support those experiencing loneliness, mental health challenges, and digital exclusion—particularly older adults, young people, and those living in more remote parts of the village. The project will strengthen community ties, promote healthier lifestyles, and create new opportunities for volunteering, learning, and social interaction, helping Dundonald thrive as a resilient and connected coastal community.

The redevelopment of this building will directly support two key outcomes:

- · Promoting good mental health and wellbeing
- · Tackling social isolation and loneliness

The building will be designed to offer:

- · A calm, inclusive environment where individuals feel safe, respected, and supported.
- · A venue for the community to offer counselling, peer support groups, and wellbeing workshops.
- · Space for preventative activities such as yoga, mindfulness, creative arts, and physical exercise.
- · Opportunities for co-design and community involvement, fostering a sense of ownership, belonging, and empowerment.

The building could also serve as a hub in the future to:

- · Host informal social spaces for conversation, shared meals, and spontaneous interaction.
- · Deliver intergenerational programmes that bring together people of all ages.
- · Create volunteering opportunities, helping individuals build purpose and community ties.
- · Provide digital inclusion support, including Wi-Fi access, devices, and skills training to help people stay connected.

Please provide information you have about the need and support for the project, eg community consultation

The need for this project has been identified through ongoing engagement with residents, local groups, and volunteers connected to the 48th Ayrshire (Dundonald) Scout Group and Craigie, Dundonald and Symington Parish Church. Community conversations in Dundonald, including those facilitated by South Ayrshire Council since 2021, have consistently highlighted mental health, social isolation and a lack of inclusive spaces as key concerns. The Scout group has received informal feedback from families, older residents, and youth participants expressing strong support for transforming the building which is not fit for purse. This redevelopment aligns with local priorities and builds on the Scout group's trusted role in the community, offering a familiar and accessible venue for expanded services. The project has the backing of local volunteers and aims to complement existing initiatives such as the award winning Dundonald Castle thriving community hub and Dundonald Sheltered Housing Community Hub, creating a network of support across age groups and needs.

- The redevelopment could provide lifelong learning opportunities through digital inclusion support, skills workshops, and volunteering.
- It would support mental health and wellbeing, which is a key concern in South Ayrshire.
- The project encourages a community-led development, helping residents build confidence, skills, and social connections.

Civic and Community Pride

- The redevelopment fosters community ownership and empowerment through codesign and volunteer involvement.
- It could strengthen local identity and pride, especially by revitalising a Scout group property that already holds community significance.
- It could act as a catalyst for intergenerational engagement, helping bridge gaps and build stronger community ties.
- Learning from the Dundonald Castle community hub which has demonstrated a transformative power of community-led regeneration.
