Project Title

Stinchar Connections – Connecting Communities	
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About your project/what are you seeking funding for?

Stinchar Connections has been successful in receiving funding for a community bus service, operated by South Ayrshire Community Transport, to connect some of the rural villages in the Stinchar Valley. The pilot bus service has been running for 1 year and has received funding for a further 6 months from Carrick Futures. Buses run at times when there is no public bus service, for example, a service on 2 mornings per week to Ballantrae to allow passengers to visit the local GP, shop, garden centre, and a chance to visit the beach and coastline; after school services which allow young people to travel home from after school clubs; early evening services which allow children to travel to and from youth clubs and sports activities in Girvan and Maybole; and a Sunday service allowing people to visit Girvan when there are very limited or no public transport options.

This additional funding would allow an extra opportunity to link the bus with youth club activities in Girvan, and also allow a later service home from Girvan on one evening per week, which will be of benefit to people travelling home from work. This service will be even more valuable to residents from Pinwherry, Pinmore and Barrhill who have seen a

recent change to their public bus timetable, with Stagecoach having withdrawn the Newton Stewart – Girvan service, and the subsequent operator having reduced the frequency of the buses. Most notably there are no buses after the school bus returns to the village, and a reduction in buses on non school days. This is similar to the public bus service provided to Colmonell in that there are no public bus services after the school bus leaves Girvan until after 10pm at night, therefore the 4pm and early evening community bus services operated by South Ayrshire Community Transport are of vital importance to these communities. All buses run to a timetable with a paid driver to ensure reliability of the service.

What community will this project be delivered in and what communities will benefit?

The project will be delivered in South Carrick, and the communities of Pinmore, Pinwherry, Barrhill, Colmonell, Ballantrae, Lendalfoot and Girvan will benefit.

Please provide information you have about the need and support for the project, eg community consultation

Prior to the project starting, the steering group sent out a survey across local Facebook pages, on posters, did letterbox drops in some of the villages, and surveyed young people from Ballantrae Youth Group to find out their views on the proposed community transport project, the routes and times/days suggested, and whether community transport would be useful on any other days of the week. We received 122 responses. The majority were in favour of days and times suggested, and also provided feedback on some other suggestions for times/days/routes which were then added to the route selection.

Following the first pilot year of the community transport initiative, an evaluation is being co-ordinated by NHS Ayrshire and Arran Public Health department to measure the success of the service. An evaluation plan has been drafted, as well as a community questionnaire, questionnaire for drivers and a focus group for steering group members. It is intended that the evaluation will allow feedback on how valuable the service has been, and feedback will also inform future development of the service. Information is currently being gathered, however there are around 130 responses to date. Analysis will be done over the next few months and a report drafted. This will help inform the development of the community bus service going forward.
