What are the main activities/purpose of the group:

National Lottery Young Start funding has been secured for an afterschool project in North Ayr which will commence in September 2025.

The project aims would be for theatre facilitators to work with and inspire a group of young students (Primary 6) to not only learn theatre skills but to develop creative and leadership skills by creating, planning and leading drama classes for younger students. The project promotes peer-led education, with students actively participating in both learning and teaching roles, ultimately creating resources for future use by schools and community groups.

The project will provide nurturing for body and mind and will provide nutritional food for its participants at each session. This will reduce child poverty and ensure children go home fully nourished, thereby easing the family financial burden.

The group will learn new skills, gain confidence that could be used in the future as they face the challenges of teenage life and moving to secondary school. Building skills that could be instrumental for potential future employment.

Purpose of grant application – please advise how the grant funding would be spent and how it would benefit recipients:

To allow these Project skills to be realised participants need to be nourished and this project will ensure healthy food resources are available at every session to nurture the physical and mental health wellbeing of the young people.

It is important that young people have nutritious food to support learning because their brains and bodies are still developing. Nutritious food assists:

- Brain Development
- Energy and Focus
- Regulating Mood and Behaviour
- · Social interactions and emotional regulation.
- Learning Performance
- Creating Long-Term Good Eating Habits
- Building resilience and supports the ability to cope with stress, both academically and socially.

In short, nutritious food fuels the body and the brain, making it a critical part of a child's ability to learn, grow, and succeed.

Total cost of idea/how much are you applying for? Please provide a breakdown:

We are seeking £2,500 for the healthy food resource for our Young Start Project. This project has already secured £33,000 for Year 1 from the National Lottery Young Start Programme.

The project will run as an after-school club throughout the academic year and support summer school activity, so this funding would have material impact in an area of social deprivation and high child poverty rates.
