а	Project Title	Cadets & Community: Growing Together
b	Ayr Sea Cadets and Royal Marines Cadets is a well-established youth development charity, proudly	
	serving the Ayrshire community for nearly 85 years. We use waterborne adventure and structured	
	learning to help young people build confidence, acquire life skills, and realise their potential. At the	
	heart of our mission is inclusion — we believe all young people, regardless of background or ability,	
	should have access to high-quality, character-building experiences.	
	Our unit currently supports of	over 40 cadets aged 10–18, guided by more than 20 dedicated adult
	volunteers who collectively of	contribute over 100 hours per week. Many of our cadets have additional





support needs, including autism, ADHD, dyslexia and dyspraxia. We work tirelessly to provide them with a safe, structured environment where they can thrive.

We combine traditional values with modern teaching: through outdoor adventure and hands-on learning, cadets develop vital skills such as resilience, discipline, teamwork and leadership. Our programme includes training in first aid, water safety, seamanship, and leadership — and it offers nationally recognised qualifications such as the Duke of Edinburgh's Award, CREST Awards from the British Science Association, and Young Leader credentials. These accreditations not only build confidence but also improve employability and school engagement.

A New Chapter for the Community: Foresters Hall

This year, we secured ownership of Foresters Hall (eight months ahead of schedule). This acquisition marked a pivotal moment for our organisation, enabling us to create a permanent base for our activities and a multi-use hub for the wider community.

Since taking possession, we have:

- Invested over £25,000 in capital improvements
- Installed new accessible facilities, including a disabled toilet
- Fully equipped a new community kitchen
- Replaced entry doors to improve security
- Completed extensive painting and refurbishment
- Delivered over 1,000 volunteer hours to bring the hall into usable condition

The result is a vibrant space that now hosts evening training sessions, weekend events, and is increasingly in demand from local groups, charities, and community users. However, to meet rising demand and ensure long-term viability, we now need to build upon this foundation.

What We Need — and Why

We are seeking support from the Community Empowerment Fund to purchase key infrastructure that will maximise the hall's flexibility, appeal and capacity to serve. These items are critical in helping us achieve our next phase of development:

1. 100-120 Folding Chairs on Trolleys

These will replace an ad-hoc mix of stackable seating, enabling us to:

- Improve storage efficiency and clear floor space for activities
- Accommodate larger groups for community events
- Donate excess chairs to smaller local groups in need

2. Secure Storage Units

Providing secure lockers or storage areas for regular hall users will:

• Encourage more groups to use the space with confidence





- · Improve organisational efficiency for multi-user scheduling
- Make the space more attractive for shared use by community projects

3. Replacement Flooring

Much of the current flooring is patchwork or temporary. We intend to install:

- Durable, uniform flooring in key areas to enhance aesthetics and safety
- Hygienic, professional-grade flooring in the kitchen
- Flooring suitable for both high-traffic and activity-based use

4. Roof Insulation Replacement

Now that roof repairs are complete, we must replace damaged insulation:

- To improve thermal efficiency and reduce heating bills
- To minimise our environmental impact and support carbon reduction targets

5. PA and Sound System

This is a frequent request from potential users. A sound system will:

- Increase hall hire appeal for public meetings, performances and community events
- Allow us to host inclusive events for all age groups, including those with hearing impairments
- Support our own cadet presentations, ceremonies and public showcases

A Platform for Long-Term Impact

These investments are part of a longer-term vision, with further capital works — including fire door upgrades, window replacement, and hall floor refurbishment — planned in a future application to the National Lottery Community Fund.

With improved facilities, we aim to:

- **Increase** youth participation by at least 25%, particularly reaching young people not currently engaged in structured activities
- **Expand** community use during daytime hours and weekends, offering space for health groups, charities, training courses and social events
- Build financial sustainability through responsible hall hire while keeping prices accessible for non-profit groups
- **Support** intergenerational engagement, enabling people of all ages to contribute to and benefit from this space

We believe Foresters Hall can become a model community venue — one that serves as both a launchpad for youth potential and a welcoming resource for all members of the community.

We thank the Community Empowerment Fund for considering our application and welcome any opportunity to discuss how our work aligns with your goals for sustainable, inclusive community development.
