Programme Overview

Participants will attend two one-hour sessions per week, followed by a social gathering with refreshments and occasional guest speakers. The sessions are tailored to support:

Physical health: improving mobility, joint function, and cardiovascular fitness.

Cognitive stimulation: aiding memory and decision-making.

Social interaction: reducing isolation and promoting inclusion.

Emotional wellbeing: creating a safe, enjoyable space for connection and support.

The programme will be delivered free of charge, ensuring no one is excluded due to financial circumstances, and will take place in Ayr, Prestwick, and Troon, with the ambition to expand based on demand.

✓ Health and Wellbeing

The programme directly supports UKSPF objectives around enhancing local health outcomes. Walking football is a proven method of encouraging physical activity in older adults while helping to slow the progression of Alzheimer's symptoms through movement and mental engagement.

Social Inclusion and Reducing Inequalities

By targeting a vulnerable, often overlooked population and offering services free of charge, the project combats social and health inequalities, a core priority of the UKSPF.

✓ Pride in Place and Community Participation

The programme fosters civic pride and strengthens community networks by using local venues and encouraging volunteer involvement. Participants are given opportunities to connect and contribute meaningfully, both during and beyond the football sessions.

Local Delivery, Local Benefit

Operating in Ayr North and nearby communities, the programme reflects UKSPF's emphasis on place-based investment. It also supports South Ayrshire Council's local Place Plans, Health & Social Care Partnership's Dementia Strategy, and broader Scottish Government goals for ageing well.
