#### What are the main activities/purpose of the group:

At AUFA, football is at the heart of everything we do — not just as a sport, but as a powerful force for positive change. Our work aligns closely with the Scottish Football Association's Power of Football initiative, which recognises football's unique ability to bring people and communities together, break down barriers, and improve lives.

We use football as a mechanism to increase awareness of, and access to, vital services and support across our community. Through our programmes, we help tackle social isolation, support mental and physical well-being, and create opportunities for personal growth. This impact is clearly reflected in initiatives like our Extra Time programme, which provides after-school support in four primary schools in Ayr North.

Additionally, our Football for Life programme — supported by the National Lottery Community Fund — offers walking football, football memories sessions, walking groups, and other activities tailored to the over-50s. These initiatives promote active lifestyles, social engagement, and community connection. We also continue to support talented young players on their football journey, offering a structured development pathway. Many have gone on to represent Ayr United, while others continue to grow and thrive through the skills and values learned here. In everything we do, we aim to harness the power of football to inspire, support, and create lasting change in our community.

Purpose of grant application – please advise how the grant funding would be spent and how it would benefit recipients:

Your funding would allow the charity to enhance the support provided through our Extra Time After Schools initiative, which directly benefits children and families living in Ayr North—the most deprived area in South Ayrshire.

This funding will be used to provide tailored, practical support for families engaged in the programme, helping to break the cycle of poverty and dependency. Many of the families we support are already engaging with services such as the Information and Advice Hub, demonstrating a commitment to improving their circumstances. Our initiative builds on this progress by offering additional, targeted support that meets immediate and longer-term needs.

Your funding would allow us to assist families with:

- Emergency food provision
- > School clothing and essential items for children
- > Heating and utility support
- Transport costs (bus and rail cards) to access training, job interviews, volunteering, or educational opportunities.

These interventions remove key barriers to participation, education, and employment. For adults, we also offer access to Level 1 coaching qualifications through the Scottish FA pathway, delivered by our trained academy staff. This provides a meaningful first step into sport-based employment or further training, supported by continued mentoring from the Academy.

Our trained staff work in close collaboration with parents, schools, and school welfare officers to assess each family's situation and ensure that the support provided is personalised and effective. The holistic nature of our approach means we are not only supporting the child's development through after-school activity but also empowering the wider family to move toward greater financial stability, independence, and wellbeing.

By tackling immediate needs and providing structured routes into training and employment, this funding will make a tangible difference in reducing child poverty and promoting lasting change in Ayr North. This work clearly is a long-term commitment from multi agencies in the community and Ayr United Football Academy with its strong presence, brand and the power of football to bring communities together, is well placed to deliver on.
