The pavilion project was tendered in 2024 and worked started in December 2024 with local construction firm MCW the appointed contractor. Work was scheduled to be completed by 31<sup>st</sup> May 2025 however with some construction delays the project will now be complete in June 2025.

The total valuation of the project is £620,614.67 (additional costs likely) and funding was secured from Sports Scotland, Scottish Football Association, Coastal Communities, Scottish Football Partnership, LT Landfill and EB Scotland Landfill.

#### **The Pavilion Project**

The pavilion has been derelict for approximately 25 years and since Vics took on the 25 lease from SAC we £55,000 on a new roof and just under £40,000 in professional fees to prior to the construction work starting. The facility will include changing facilities, facilities for officials, accessible facilities for participants and spectators and a community hub area where we can deliver activities for young people and adults.

Since the facility was upgraded in 2021, Vics In The Community have made upgrades to enhance our visitors and communities experience including spectator barriers, benches, dugouts and are currently in the final construction stages of our redeveloped Pavilion and Community Hub.

NVP has become the cornerstone of our community, a place people feel safe and can get support and advice in addition to the opportunities to participate in football. The pavilion will all us to host a range of activities for young people and adults and will be a community asset.

The Trustees do however recognise the significant antisocial behaviour in the area and the risk to the building once it is completed, therefore this application is to assist with security.

#### c What community will this project be delivered in and what communities will benefit?

NVP is located in Whitletts with North Ayr that is recognised as the most deprived community in South Ayrshire and among the top 5% data zones in Scotland. People living the community experience the poorest outcomes including lower life expectancy, poorer attainment, poverty and poorer mental health and wellbeing.

Vics In The Community is recognised as the anchor organisation that assists children and families living in poverty, the community team continue to support mental health and wellbeing, food insecurity, financial hardship and people who are digitally excluded.

Our base at NVP is the cornerstone of the community with over 1000 visitors weekly across our organised kids and adult teams, community programmes and volunteers. We offer opportunities across the full lifespan from kids' football to our walking football programmes for both males and females.





	Our project will support people living in our local community and people registered with our teams and programmes. The Community Hub will provide a facility to delivery adult learning, employability, youth work and drop-ins for families.
