
## South Carrick Community Transport – survey responses March 2024

A survey was sent to residents in villages of Colmonell, Pinwherry, Pinmore, Barrhill, Ballantrae and Lendalfoot via Facebook, email, letterbox drop and posters, during February and March 2024, to gather views on providing a community transport service, which would operate alongside existing bus services.

There were 122 responses to the survey, details of which are contained in the following report.

'Other' responses included 2 from Poundland and one from Girvan.


2. Please tell us which age category you fit into






4. How often would you use the proposed community bus service?





How does it work if you have a bus pass?

As a holder of a senior citizen bus pass I am eager that I use public transport whenever I can .. and hopefully these innovative service initiatives will encourage others, of whatever age ,to do

so Use it or lose it Thanks for the survey Frequency of use question allows it seems only a simple answer. As I mention my answers differ per route proposal

Would you use the following bus services?' question can't be answered without consideration of the cost of the bus fare. Also Q3 is a mandatory question, but there is no option for 'no'. So I had to tick one to complete this survey. Please disregard my answer to 3 - I would not be using the bus. Please redesign the form so that your answers aren't skewed because of a requirement to tick a box.

Anything that helps people out and about is a great thing as not everyone drives

Journeys between Barrhill and Glasgow won't be resolved for me and my family until the trains are able to run again bet Stranraer and Ayr and onwards!

We do not have any bus service on a Sunday.

The spt are cutting the 1.45 return from colmonell in july. the last bus 3.30 goes to lendalfoot. I metion this for family with no car can not place their children in nursery in colmonell.

Although I drive and have a vehicle my children use the bus from Colmonell to Girvan and Girvan to Colmonell. The times of the buses are ridiculous and more often if possible they have to be collected at Ballantrae as times of buses more flexible.

If these or some of these services were put on and could be relayed upon. Then hopefully more people would use them As trips out would be easier to organise. It would also be good to have a bus leaving the hospital around 5 as this would coincide with the Ayr train service. Also a weekend service would be very helpful too

At present we only have a 2hr service. So this prevents me from leaving the village during the week days due to school commitments

It would be nice if the bus included Smyrton, where I stay. We have a few "elders" here who may also like to use the bus, but can't get down to Ballantrae.

More regular service to ballantrae for doctors, post office and shop

A more regular service running between Barrhill, Colmonell & Ballantrae between the house of 9.30 - 1.00 & 3.00 - 5.00 on week days to allow people to get down to Collect prescriptions from the medical centre & use the post office

At the moment I drive but in the future if necessary I would use the services.

Due to cataract surgery recently I was unsure if I would be able to drive to my work in Colmonell and would therefore rely on the local bus service to get to work and return to Girvan.

There are no buses for me to get from after school clubs home just now

Unfortunately it makes journey times to & from Girvan/Ballantrae much longer than the current direct service therefore not practical for our family.

Going through several villages tends to be tedious. Ambulances going to Ayr and picking up passengers had to give up doing it

Is this service to run alongside current services? Why isn't this made clear either way?

Yes: it would be far better and give more control over the use, if the village of Colmonell were to buy their own vehicle, preferably a six seater transit already adapted with rear door entry with 3 seats either side of a central aisle. This could be driven by a team of volunteer drivers (but made available to all villagers) who would require no special licence requirements. The vehicle could be services, maintained under a special contract arrangement made with Ballantrae garage who would be able to give special terms and guarantee. A special radius operational limit would be set to avoid abuse of such a vehicle

It is very very important we use existing public service buses to and from Colmonell .else we will, and should lose them . Even if it a token gesture .if one is fortunate enough to have a car once the sporting venues are repairing I would be looking to use the service more often

I think this is an excellent idea to supplement a very sparce public transport service

We need a later bus in our village. Our latest bus is 5.30pm not great for younger people Daughter would use wed weekly, Friday used by myself and children monthly at minimum, most likely fortnightly. If there was a later returning Fri or sat service from Girvan to Colmonell then would use the earlier services much more frequently.

If I go to after school class there are no buses until the 10.30pm bus that gets me home at 11pm. Which means I have to miss clubs or get my parents to pick me up because 11pm is to late when I have school the next morning.

It is a good service but not really suitable for us at the moment

Great service ladies won't use it at the moment but certainly will in the future. Many thanks Good luck with application. Not something we will use for now. Maybe in future
