Celebrating Carrick in The Community	

# About your project/what are you seeking funding for?

Funding will provide two days of activities at Dolphin House for up to 60 young people, including transport from Girvan, Maybole, and surrounding villages. It will also support our youth rugby festivals and the Youth Christmas party.

Dolphin House activities help young people bond, try new challenges, build confidence, and support their wellbeing in a safe setting. Both events bring together players, volunteers, and families to recognise success with the wider community.

For many young people, the rural locality of the area and the lack of opportunities to socialise in a safe environment is a major barrier to well-being. Having delivered multiple courses with Active Schools at Dolphin House the benefits to the young people are clear, increased confidence, trying new and challenging activities, developing teamwork and becoming closer as a group. This offers benefits beyond the pitch to the both the young people directly and to their families and communities.

The young people develop resilience and a sense of adventure, despite the proximity to Maybole many young people have never been to the castle or the park. Being able to experience this amongst a group of their peers is a great benefit and can encourage them to take advantage of the natural facilities that surround them.

The micro mini and youth festivals of rugby are a great way for young people to mix with players, officials and coaches from different areas. Developing self-confidence and communication skills as well as having fun and learning to communicate with a wide range of people. This is particularly valuable for young children coming from very small village primary schools and isolated rural locations.

The festivals offer free locally sourced food for players and are a great way for people of all ages to mix and socialise whilst supporting young people to engage in fun, healthy activity. The achievement awards are given out to young people at the

festivals to celebrate their achievements both on and off the pitch with their families and are given out after matches and at our end of season celebrations.

The Christmas party is primarily funded by volunteer donations, and every child receives a practical gift. For example, this year, all children under 12 were given a sweatshirt, which received positive feedback from parents and children. There is an aim to continue this initiative so that every child under 12 receives a gift during the next Christmas event.

#### What community will this project be delivered in and what communities will benefit?

The project will be delivered in Maybole but will benefit young people in communities from as far apart Ballantrae to Ayr and include young people from across North and South Carrick.

# Please provide information you have about the need and support for the project, eg community consultation

The number of children each week at Carrick Rugby provides evidence of need, as does the level of volunteering from across the community. Feedback from parents indicates the value of Carrick Rugby to the community. The interaction with social media across the entire club, but particularly around the youth section, is at a very high level. The club is still growing due to our presence in the community, local primary schools, the newly created Schools of Rugby in Girvan and Carrick Academy and working alongside Active Schools across the region.
