Project Title

Dr Bike Sessions by CGX Cycle Works	

About your project/what are you seeking funding for?

Dr Bike is a familiar name for a bike mechanic carrying out free bike checks for members of a local community at a particular time and accessible location.

Bikes are given a safety 'M-check' comprising checks of the essential working parts. The fit of the bike is checked and optimised and minor maintenance is carried out such as adjusting the brakes and checking the wear of the chain. With tools provided, riders are coached in correctly inflating their own tyres and checking their brakes. If required (and funded!) bells can be fitted, and worn chains, brake-pads and cables replaced.

Riders are advised of more serious faults requiring workshop attention, and provided a servicing referral sheet to present to a cycle workshop of their choice.

These Dr Bike sessions are also a good opportunity to make the public aware of the funding of free reused bikes and free annual services for riders in financial hardship - a Scottish Government programme administered by Cycling UK and delivered at CGX Cycle Works.

During Oct and November 25, CoMoUK (Collaborative Mobility UK), in partnership with Ayrshire Roads alliance, is locating one of its Pop-up Mobility Hubs on Ayr esplanade. They are seeking local partner organisations to carry out Active Travel activities and funding would enable CGX Cycle Works to carry out a number of Dr Bike Sessions at this hub, increasing the impact of this place/space enhancing and active travel promoting project.

What community will this project be delivered in and what communities will benefit?

Dr Bike Sessions will be held at Community events, in local public spaces, and in the schools of Coastal Communities in South Ayrshire.

Please provide information you have about the need and support for the project, eg community consultation

CGX Cycle Works has been asked to provide Dr Bike sessions at SAC led Community Events, taking part in the Communities Fun Day, Earth Day, ExplorAyr, an NHS Ayrshire and Arran Active Travel Day and SAC school fairs.

We are asked by SAC Schools to deliver Dr Bike sessions on site, servicing bikes whilst also taking referrals and delivering free bikes to families in financial hardship, the preparation of which is funded by the Scottish Government and Cycling UK (CGX has delivered 400 free bikes during 2024/25). CoMoUK has requested local Active Travel organisations to partner with it during deployment of its Pop-up Mobility Hub to Ayr.
