About your project/what are you seeking funding for?

The South

We seek funding for initial development costs for The South, including community consultation costs and early concept meetings with consultants.

We are currently looking into purchasing the South Parish Church in Girvan to be used as a multi-purpose community venue for performances etc. of up to 450 people, and as a function space for up to 180 people. No such venue has existed in Girvan since the Beach Pavillion was demolished 15 years ago and as such, there is an identifiable need in the community.

We also aim to convert the church hall into a modern bunkhouse for walkers, cyclists, and for people attending functions or events at the venue. Recent Surveys by GoGirvan have highlighted the need for accommodation, and it will also increase the financial viability of the project. In addition, we are exploring the option of incorporating a commercial kitchen into the complex which could be used both by the venue and other community groups in partnership.

We have successfully delivered the first in a series of public engagement exercises to better understand the needs and wants of the community, and to ascertain their support for the project. Our next steps are to engage consultants to help us develop the project to RIBA 0-2, including options appraisal, feasibility study and concept designs. We are looking for funding to help us do both these things.

What community will this project be delivered in and what communities will benefit?

Beneficiaries of the project will include residents of the KA26 area, specifically Girvan, who will arguably benefit from us bringing a currently empty building back into use for the community. This project will benefit the whole of the community of Girvan, as it will allow us to bring significant performers in music, dance, theatre and comedy to Girvan, and it will also allow the people of Girvan to hold large functions like weddings etc, without having to travel a distance, and hiring buses to take their guests there and back.

In addition, the project will create new employment opportunities under a social enterprise model in the hospitality sector, and has the potential to increase tourism in the town, benefiting local businesses. Any surplus profits will be used to further benefit the community. Lastly, this project will benefit the population of the wider South Carrick area, and even the people of South Ayrshire.

Please provide information you have about the need and support for the project, eg community consultation

We held our first community engagement event on 3rd September and we had over 300 people through the door. As well as a number of information boards about the project, and a short film about our vision, we got a lot of feedback, suggestions and ideas by using a brainstorming board, graphic suggestion sheets, an anonymised survey and simply by talking to the public. We also asked them to register as supporters of the project, which a significant number did, although we are still processing all the feedback and supporter material.

We are continuing this by having the survey forms and supporter registration available online, and by attending further 3rd sector events in the near future. We have also been running an extensive social media campaign to inform the community about our plans for the buildings, and to get further feedback from them.

Early results from the first community consultation indicate this project is very well-supported by the local community, with the majority of comments praising the initiative of the group and calling the project 'much-needed' and 'transformative'. Minor issues of concern were raised which we seek to address through our options appraisal and feasibility study, and we will continue to engage with the community on these.

The project also ties in with the wider regeneration efforts in the town, including Girvan's Story Heritage Project, the Bandstand refurbishment and the train station kiosk redevelopment.

Lastly, this project aligns with priorities identified in the Thriving Places Plan (2021) and the Create Streets Community Consultation survey (2022), both of which identified the
communities desire for an events space, for better opportunities for increasing tourism, and for finding uses for empty buildings in the town.
